***Any course designated as a "Level 2 Explorations course" will transfer as an elective if the student transfers to Jewell with less than 26 hours completed post-high school graduation OR does not successfully complete the 2 classes required for each category.**

To be admitted to Jewell: transfer students must have at minimum transferrable GPA of at least a 2.5 with at least 26 hours completed post-high school graduation.

The courses suggested in this guide are the preferred courses that best prepare students for success at William Jewell College. For a Level 2 Explorations requirement in the William Jewell College core curriculum to be fulfilled using transfer credit, students MUST have successfully completed two (2) courses in two (2) different disciplines.

The William Jewell College Accounting program requires 124 credit hours to complete a degree in accounting and was not designed to meet the 150 credit hour requirement necessary for eligibility to take the Certified Public Accountant (CPA) exam. Students interested in obtaining their CPA license are advised to indicate their intent to be involved in the Accounting Professional Program. The Accounting Professional Program is an advisory program designed to inform students about the requirements to obtain one's CPA license in the state of Missouri and to assist students in devising a plan that will allow them to meet the educational requirements to both sit for the CPA exam and apply for one's CPA license in the state of Missouri.
