



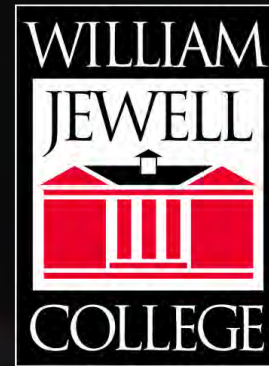

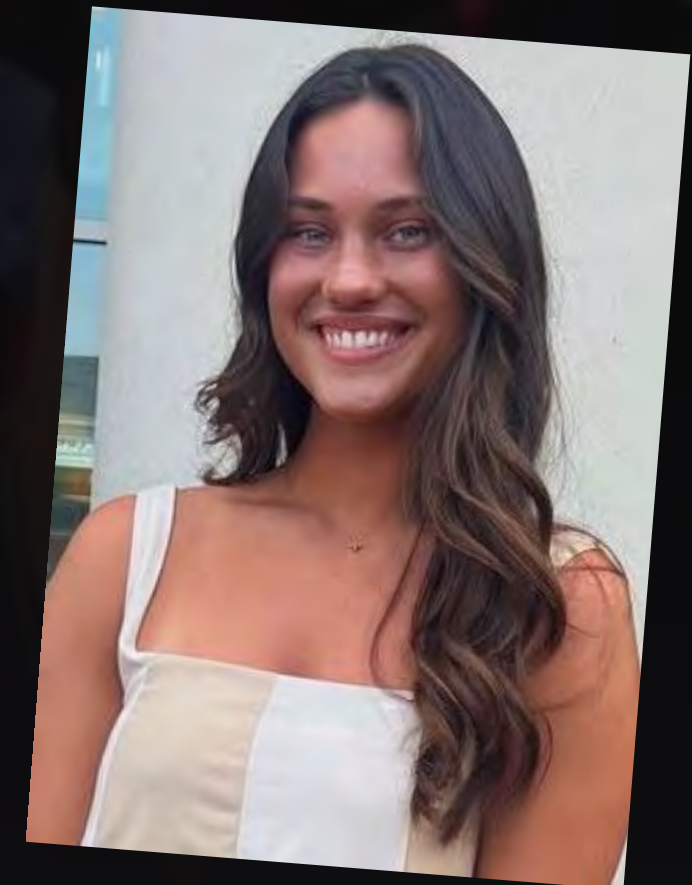

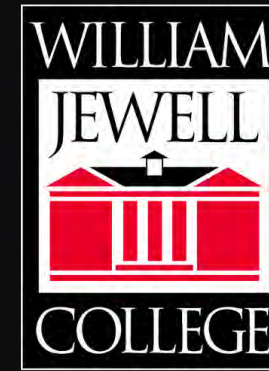

"My time at William Jewell was truly the best time of my life, and I will forever be grateful for all it gave me."

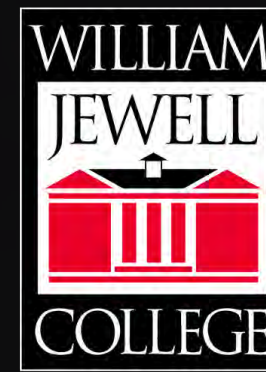


How has your Jewell experience impacted you and what you are doing now?

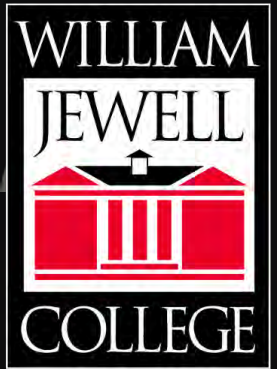
What do you admire about Jewell?

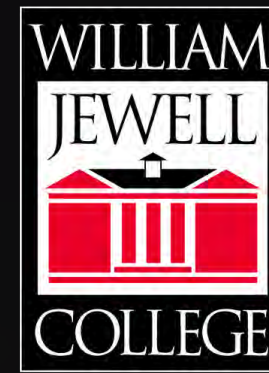

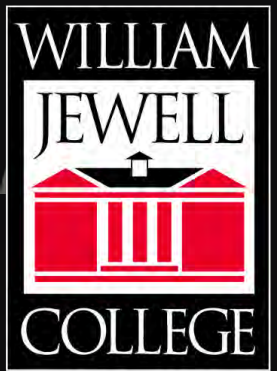
